1. olecranon process
2. styloid process

1. head
2. radial tuberosity
3. styloid process

Pelvic Girdle/Coxal (pg. 227-228)

1. ilium/iliac crest
2. ischium
3. pubis
4. pubis symphysis
5. acetabulum
6. obturator foramen

1. head/neck
2. greater trochanter

Terms to know for bones/Bone Parts

_____ - any marked, bony prominence

_____ - a large process for attachment of muscle, such as the one found on the femur

_____ - depression or cavity in or on a bone

_____ - an orifice through which blood vessels, nerves and ligaments pass

_____ - any sharp, slender projection, such as a spinous process

_____ - a large rounded process

_____ - a small rounded process

_____ - a terminal enlargement, such as the head of the humerus

_____ - a rounded or knuckle-like prominence, usually at articulation points

_____ - a narrow ridge of bone
